Guidelines for Author Submission to the 2027 Savannah Book Festival

The annual Savannah Book Festival (SBF) will take place this year from February 4 - 7, 2027. The 40+ nationally recognized authors who are invited to attend will give solo presentations in historic venues throughout downtown Savannah and sign their books in Telfair Square. These events are free and open to the public.

SBF also features three headlining authors at ticketed events on Thursday, Friday, and Sunday.

Please read all the following information before submitting a book to SBF:

To be considered for the 2027 Festival, the book must be published after the previous year's Festival.

Criteria for submissions:

1. Publications dates - books eligible for the 2027 Festival must be published after **February 9, 2026**
2. Traditionally published – the Festival relies on traditional publishers to help vet submissions, ensuring a manageable selection process
3. Adult literature – the Festival is focused on adult literature

When should a book be submitted?

We accept submissions of books from March 1, 2026, through June 30, 2026, in the calendar year preceding the Festival.

Who decides which authors are invited?

An all-volunteer Author Advisory Council reviews the submissions and chooses the authors who will receive an invitation. Invitations are sent beginning in July 2026 with the schedule of authors in place in December.

What types of books are considered?

While we review all books that are submitted, our primary goal is to provide an excellent and diverse mix of literature for all attendees and participating authors featuring books from the following genres:

- Fiction — with an emphasis on literary fiction, including historical fiction, thrillers, women’s fiction and more.
- Narrative nonfiction — history, biography, memoir, and essays. Nonfiction books are considered from a variety of perspectives that encourage and engage in fair, respectful discussions of historical figures, and ideas
- Graphic novels
- Cookbooks and food-related titles
- Art and architecture titles
- Titles with a local focus
- Poetry

What types of books are not considered?

Due to the volume of work submitted, the Savannah Book Festival does not consider self-published, author-financed, or hybrid titles. The Festival may rely on traditional publishers to help vet submissions, ensuring a manageable selection process. The SBF's focus is on adult literature, therefore, children’s books are not considered. SBF does include one to two YA or YA crossover books each year.

What happens when a book is selected?

We typically begin sending invitations to invited authors in July with the schedule of authors in place by December. Notification letters to successful applicant(s) will be sent by November 12, 2016; failure to receive notice of approval by that date should be taken as notice of declination; **letters of declination will not be sent.**

Book Sales and Signings:

The Festival works with E. Shaver Booksellers to order frontlist and up to four backlist titles for sale during the Festival. Only books purchased at the Festival are eligible for signing. Festival Saturday authors head to the Book Signing Tent after their presentation to sign books.

Travel:

Savannah Book Festival covers domestic, coach travel and lodging expenses for authors travelling out of state. Our presenting authors stay at beautiful hotels located in the heart of Savannah's historic district, close to all Festival venues.

SBF@Schools:

Savannah Book Festival invites participating authors to arrive in Savannah a day early to take part in SBF@Schools. In 2026, over 20 authors volunteered to visit public middle and high schools on Friday morning. Authors express that this program is often the highlight of their Festival experience.

Please keep in mind:

There is no fee for submissions.

Meeting the criteria for consideration **does not guarantee** an invitation to participate in the Festival as a featured author. Books submitted for consideration will not be returned, and authors will receive neither feedback nor critique of submitted works.
